Spike Graham Orchestra to pay tribute to

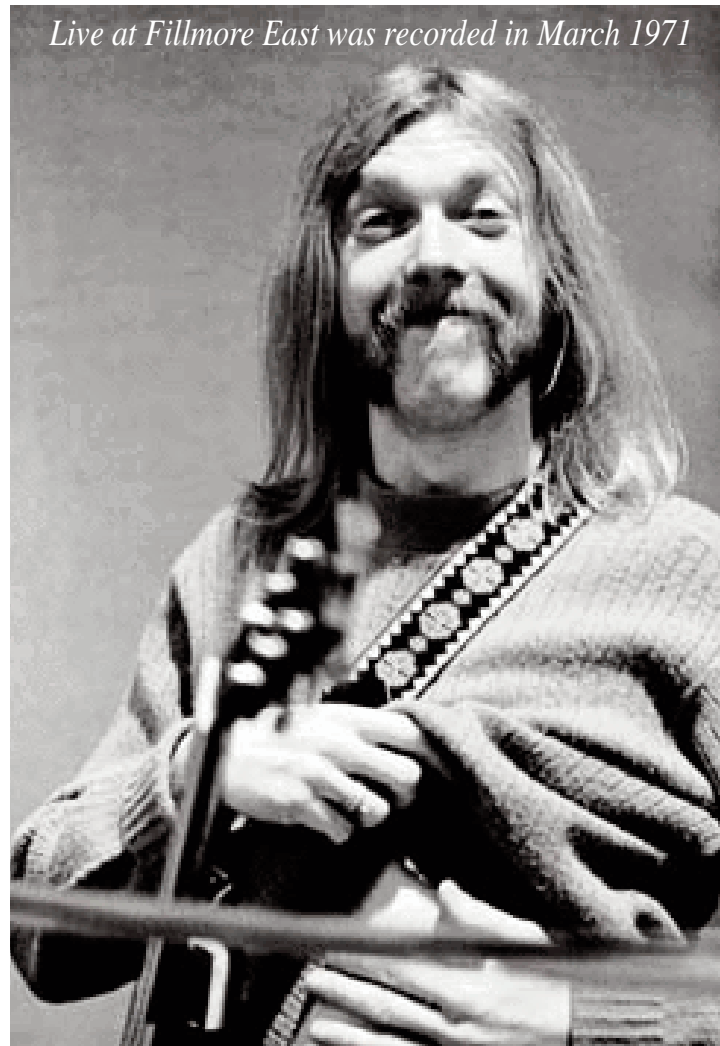
Duane Allman

OLD ALABAMA TOWN - The Spike Graham Orchestra will pay tribute to Duane Allman on October 21 by playing the entire Allman Brothers' Live At Fillmore East album from beginning to end.

The concert will be held about one week prior to the 40th anniversary of guitarist Duane Allman's death in a motorcycle crash. Allman was killed in an accident in Macon, Georgia, just a few months after the release of the *Fillmore East* Album, which set the standard for live rock performances at the time.

Spike Graham Orchestra's tribute will not track the double album note by note, but include the musicians' interpretations of timeless songs such as *Statesboro Blues*, *Whipping Post*, *In Memory of Elizabeth Reed*, and *One Way Out*.

The October 21 show will begin at 7 pm at Kiwanis Park in Old Alabama Town as part of the Alabama Roots Music Society's ARMSchair series. Admission is \$2 per person. There will not be any concessions on site, so attendees are encouraged to bring their own food and beverages. They should also bring lawn chairs. Gates open at 6:30 pm.

UNION STATION - Blues Guitarist Bryan Lee, a co-winner of the 2011 Rock Blues Album of the Year, will be the featured performer at JUKE 4 under the Union Station Train Shed on September 23, 2011.

Often referred to as Braille Blues Daddy, the blind musician was awarded the coveted Blues Foundation award in May for his work with Kenny Wayne Sheperd on the album *Live! In Chicago*. The album also features Hubert Sumlin, Willie "Big Eyes" Smith, and Buddy Flett.

Lee, a longstanding performer at The Old Absinthe House in New Orleans, was also nominated for a Grammy award this year for Best Contemporary Blues Album of the Year.

A Wisconsin native, Lee was first exposed to blues music on AM-radio and he began playing guitar at the age of 13. His idols were Muddy Waters and Howlin' Wolf. He played the Chicago circuit for years before moving to New Orleans. Bryan Lee performed his 27th Jazz Fest in May 2011.

Also appearing at Juke 4 will be Spike Graham and the Lounge Loafers, a group of Montgomery-area blues/rock musicians whose intermission performances are always met with anticipation of the annual music event.

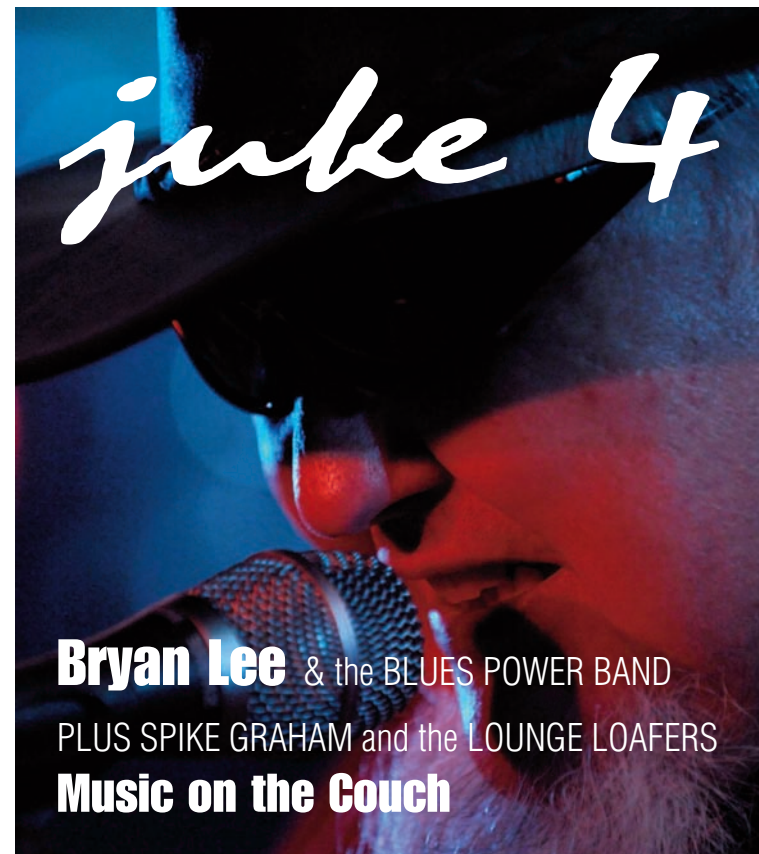
ARMS Concerts at the Capri

Webb Wilder

OLD ALABAMA TOWN - His music defies categorization and he professes to be "The Last of the Full Grown Men."

His credo is "Work Hard. Rock Hard. Sleep Hard. Grow Big. Wear Glasses If You Need 'Em." He has been described as an evangelist for real rock 'n' roll.

This is Webb Wilder, a contemporary guitarist who will perform

October 7 as part of the Alabama Roots Music Society's ARMSchair series at Old Alabama Town.

Wilder, who has performed all across this country and Europe, is a master of many genres of music, including blues, rock, and country. He says his band, The Beatnecks, play "rock for roots fans and roots for rock fans."

The Associated Press once described his music and stage performance as "a glorious amalgamation of grunge chords, killer grooves, Screamin' Jay Hawkins theatrics, a healthy sense of humor, and great pop melodies."

Wilder, a native of Hattiesburg, Mississippi, has received many accolades for his music, but he is also well known for his indie films, his radio commercial voice overs, and for being one of XM Satellite Radio's first deejays. He is the epitome of a true roots rocker.
